WELCOME BACK MISS LEASK

"FIRES, FLOODS, FLUS-AND A LITTLE SIGHTSEEING IN BETWEEN"

G'day folks! I'm back from the land down under, and let me say it was a year I'll never forget! When I arrived in Australia, the bushfires were out of control and pretty close to where I lived. The air was filled with smoke and it wasn't at all like the Australia I expected - not a kangaroo or koala in sight (and not even any snakes or spiders). The staff at Hawkesbury High School are amazing and made me feel instantly at home! It was fun to teach with an entire English department and with people who were teaching the same classes: it made planning a lot easier when we shared the load. The students complete one assignment a term, so there was way less formal marking. It was a nice break, but I'll be sure to get back into form as quickly as possible! I had lots of free evenings at the beginning and spent my time in the Blue Mountains (where Miss S. lives) doing loads of hiking (or bushwalking as they call it). I think I could have hiked every single day and never have run out of new trails. In February it rained nearly 220mm of rain over one weekend and I couldn't get to school as the rivers had all flooded. Instead I got to visit some more local schools and act as a substitute until the bridges reopened three days later. When Covid hit. I spent lots of time hiking, again, and spent time exploring with a couple of the other teachers as soon as we were allowed to get together. We got up early and saw some really awesome sunrises over the ocean - well worth the 4AM alarms! We missed our first break because of lockdown but made the most of the others. We went back to teaching in the classroom about a month after Easter and from then on, school was business as usual. In July, I met up with one of the other teachers on exchange and we drove north all the way up the coast of New South Wales and into Queensland. My favourite stops were the Hunter Valley, Tamworth (the country music capital of Australia), Dorrigo National Park, Byron Bay, and the Glass House Mountains. We spent lots of time enjoying the beaches (even though it wasn't swimming weather - 20 degrees in winter isn't bad, but still doesn't make a warm ocean). Term 3 was relatively uneventful at the school, but there were enough Covid cases close to me that I still couldn't leave the state for the spring holiday. Another exchange teacher was in the same boat, so this time we went south and west to explore the rest of New South Wales. We climbed the tallest mountain (Koszicko), saw Mungo National Park and made it all the way out to Broken Hill on the far west edge of the state. In term 4, I tried to take advantage of the warmer weather and spent lots of time on the beach. I was pretty good about using SPF50+, but the Aussie sun is hot, hot, hot and I managed a number of sunburns. I was hoping to head to Melbourne and Tasmania for Christmas, but well, Covid got in the way again, so I headed north and spent Christmas on the beach. I'm lucky to have met so many wonderful people in the last year and to have had the experience I did. I'm excited to be home again, and cannot wait to see all of your faces next week! It'll be heaps good!
